What a great year 2019 was for the Boys & Girls Club of Benton County.

Here are just a few highlights from the year:



In March of 2019 we celebrated the accomplishments of our Youth of the Year winner, Shakira, at our annual Youth of the Year event. Shakira has been an active member of our Rogers Club for 3 years, during which time she served as President of the Keystone teen leadership club. She is a senior at Rogers High School and manages a full load of honors courses all while being an active leader in the Club and community.

In May of 2019 we opened the doors to our new Teen Center in Rogers. The space includes a game room, technology center with computers and a Learning Center where teens can do homework and study. The new facility has the capacity for 80 members in 8th – 12th grade.





In August of 2019 we launched a new program, Girls Who Code, at our Rogers Teen Center and Bentonville Unit. The program equips young girls with the necessary computing skills, such as programming, robotics and web design, to pursue 21st century opportunities.


A BIG THANK YOU
